



I am somebody





The Ambassador was very interested in our vision of a "Skill Center" (furtherance center). This project idea developed more and more to a focus topic because next year the first children of our center will complete School and thus will leave the center.

The question of what will happen to these young lifes in an environment where 90% of those leaving School are unemployed, is a concern. It is extremely difficult to even find temporary work and a fixed employment is usually out of reach. They can only dream of a systematic training which would improve their chances. Therefore, we would like to offer an opportunity of a focused and systematic training, primarily for our orphans but also for young people from the local community. We think of the professions in the building industry and plan a practical training as an allrounder. We would also like to convey basic know-how in computer science and develop expertise in cooking / catering / decorating and sewing. For all areas we plan a basic education in management and will teach various themes from a life skill training programme. A Skill Center will support the young people to find a job as qualified workers. Moreover, we trust that many individuals will be motivated to start their own business as young entrepreneurs.

Currently, we are working on a detailed concept together with competent professionals from South Africa. The Swiss Ambassador opened new doors for us to key people and organizations where we trust to find support for this project.
